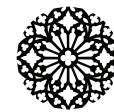

## PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATES FOR BAPTISM

*The People remain seated. The Candidates and Sponsors gather before the altar. The Celebrant says*

The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*The Candidates are presented individually by their Sponsors, as follows*

I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*The Celebrant addresses the Parents and Godparents, saying*

Will you be responsible for seeing that the children you present are brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents and Godparents*

I will, with God's help.

*The Celebrant then says*

Will you by your prayers and witness help these children to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Parents and Godparents*

I will, with God's help.

*Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the Parents and Godparents, who speak on behalf of the children.*

*Question* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

*Answer* I do.

*The Celebrant addresses the People, saying*

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

*People* We will.


*Celebrant* Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

*All stand, as able.*

## THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

- Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Father?
- People* I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- Celebrant* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- People* I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
- Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- People* I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
- Celebrant* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?
- People* I will, with God's help.
- Celebrant* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?
- People* I will, with God's help.
- Celebrant* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?
- People* I will, with God's help.
- Celebrant* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?
- People* I will, with God's help.
- Celebrant* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?
- People* I will, with God's help.

## PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATES

- Celebrant* Let us now pray for these Persons who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth.
- Cantor* Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.
- People*  Lord, hear our prayer.
- Cantor* Open their hearts to your grace and truth.
- People* Lord, hear our prayer.
- Cantor* Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.
- People* Lord, hear our prayer.
- Cantor* Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.
- People* Lord, hear our prayer.
- Cantor* Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.
- People* Lord, hear our prayer.
- Cantor* Send them into the world in witness to your love.

**THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER**

The font is filled with water.

*Celebrant* The Lord be with you. *People* And al - so with you.

*Celebrant* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People* It is right to give God thanks and praise.

The Celebrant continues, blessing the water, and the People respond, "Amen."

The People are seated.

**THE BAPTISMS**

The People are seated. Each Candidate is presented by name to the baptizing Priest, who then pours water upon the Candidate, saying

N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then the Celebrant places a hand on each Person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross with Chrism and says

N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

When this action has been completed for all Candidates, the People stand, as able.

The Celebrant then prays over the Neophytes, and the People respond, "Amen."

*Celebrant* Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*Celebrant and People*

We receive you into the household of God.  
Confess the faith of Christ crucified,  
proclaim his resurrection,  
and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

**THE PEACE**

*Celebrant* The peace of the Lord be always with you.

*People* And also with you.

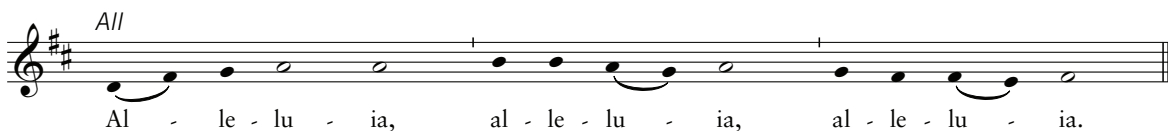
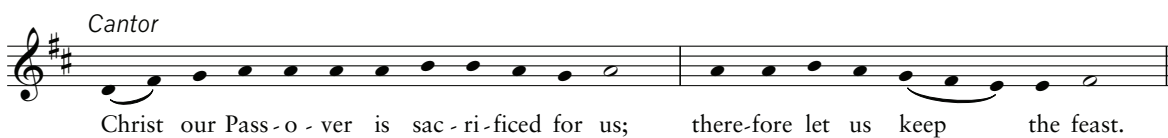

## THE COMMUNION

The Holy Communion is distributed under the forms of both Bread and Wine. In the interest of public health, the Cathedral does not practice intinction, that is, the dipping of the Bread into the Wine. It is the faith of the Church that Jesus gives himself in the Sacrament whether it is received in only one kind or both. Gluten-free Wafers are available; please make your need known to the minister.

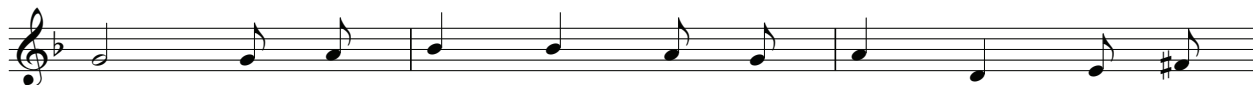
