The Officiant says

The Officiant blesses the bicycles, asperging them with water with intentions for safety, health and well-being.

The Benediction

The Officiant pronounces this blessing

May the wind be ever at your back. May all your journeying be joyous. And until we meet again, May the Lord hold you and your bicycles in the palm of his hand.
